Rear View Mirror: ERP systems excel at providing a historical record of what happened in a business. They are architected to formalize appropriate accounting procedures and manage high-volume transaction processing. As the financial system of record, ERP systems provide significant value to the business. However, ERP architectures do not provide the required flexibility for planning or scenario-based modeling, both of which are critical to budgeting and supply chain management activities that are more futuristic, than historic, in nature.

Front Windshield: BoB Supply Chain Execution (SCE) systems are designed to prioritize tactical or short-term operational activities and help a business stay focused on key daily and weekly tasks to keep the supply chain running smoothly and cost effectively. Such activities consist of short-term planning and monitoring of warehouse, transportation and customer service organizations to track work flows, order fulfillment, on-time deliveries and actual performance compared to corporate goals. ERP systems are critical to order management, customer credit policies and proper invoicing, but are less robust in supporting warehouse workflow management, optimized transportation planning and shipment management.

Telescope: BoB Supply Chain Planning (SCP) systems are designed to provide telescopic insight to what might happen in the future, incorporating what-if analysis, dynamic feedback, optimization and synchronization between demand, supply and production operations. BoB SCP solutions can also leverage historical performance to predict future needs and capabilities, which enable companies to extract additional value from an ERP investment. BoB SCP solutions, such as those from Logility, offer extended flexibility, multiple planning scenarios and demand signals, optimized sourcing and production management, and the ability to re-plan quickly to leverage the latest supply chain intelligence. BoB SCP solutions provide greater flexibility than ERP systems for bringing future business scenarios into perspective, including "wide-angle" or long-term planning to accelerate new product introductions, optimize production and streamline a supply network. They also sport "zoom" features for shorter-term, detailed analysis about the impact of specific business opportunities such as the cost to serve a new customer or expand sales channels.
